*Sequence*

Introduction (attention, good will and receptivity)

Statement of Facts (essential in a court case)

Thesis (very brief, perhaps divided into up to three points)

Proofs (of various kinds – syllogisms, evidence, character, history etc.)

Conclusion (summary, amplification, pity)
