(A) IS THERE A UNIT OF ARGUMENT?

There is a kind of frame, between the opening appeal and the final prayer, as follows:

- 12:1 I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. 2 Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.
- 13 May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

(C) WHAT ARE THE KEY TEXTS, IN EACH SECTION, ALONG THE WAY?

A few key texts capture the import of all this advice:

12:1 I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a **living sacrifice**, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. 2 Do not be conformed to this world, but **be** transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.

- 13:10 Love does no wrong to a neighbour; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.
- <u>14:7</u> We do not **live** to **ourselves**, and we do not **die** to **ourselves**. <u>8</u> If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, **we are the Lord's**.
- <u>15:7</u> Welcome one another, therefore, just as **Christ** has welcomed you, for the **glory** of God. <u>8</u> For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the **circumcised** on behalf of the **truth** of God in order that he might confirm the **promises** given to the patriarchs, <u>9</u> and in order that the **Gentiles** might **glorify** God for his **mercy**.
